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We were hoping to come to the PC meeting tonight but I'm afraid we are unable to do so. So, a brief message or two:

We and our neighbours want to thank the PC, the chair Bryan Carson and Beth Huntley for their unwavering support over Waves Edge's roof height. Last week's hearing at the SHDC meeting voted overwhelmingly against the developer and - at the same time - established a clear principle that coastal properties which are rebuilt or developed must be NO HIGHER than the existing property on the site. This principle - enshrined in the NP - needs to be extended to all sea front properties in B-o-S and also in Bantham. With this in mind, we totally oppose the utterly amateur and ridiculous plans for Warren Cottage and the Bay Cafe. Others will say this more eloquently, but it is hard to conceive of a more crass and ugly proposal for such an iconic location. We will oppose it in every way.

The Bigbury Neighbourhood Plan team have done an exceptional job in establishing baseline principles for the future and their work is to be applauded.

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The next Parish Council meeting is scheduled for Wednesday May 16th 2018

"Last year, local residents on a visit to Modbury's twin town of Lanveoc in Brittany saw their French counterparts participating in activities associated with an annual civic day, volunteering a little time to tackle a range of tasks to make their locality more attractive - things like weeding public flower beds, mending broken items, cleaning signs, redecorating a public hall, painting up a converted container for sharing books. Modbury Parish Council took this idea onboard, and by the time you read this, Modbury Marigolds Day will have taken place, with residents sprucing up the town after the winter ready for visitors. Equally, Bigbury Parish Council is proposing the idea of a civic day in our parish, to tackle some of the niggling jobs that get raised by parishioners, but that just never seem to get to the top of the priorities list in these days of cutbacks! The parish is not only a beautiful home to many of us, but also a prime spot for tourism, which contributes financially to our local businesses, so keeping the area attractive helps sustain those businesses and in turn the residents - a win-win all round for our community.

The parish clerk has been compiling a list of tasks that might be done under the auspices of a civic day. If you have something in mind to suggest - please, a job on public land, and safe! - and/or would be prepared to volunteer a couple of hours or so to undertake a task, with a friend or as part of a small group, please do contact the people below by the next Parish Council meeting, Wednesday 16th May. (NB this is a week later than the usual date for council meetings). A decision will be taken at the meeting on whether there is sufficient response to proceed, (the tentative dates are Friday 1st or 8th June), and on the precise organisation of 'Busy B(igbury) Day'. It would be lovely if each part of the parish, or St Ann's Chapel, Bigbury Village and Bigbury on Sea at least, can have an activity occur that makes that community noticeably improved!

The people to contact about helping with this novel community action are: Parish Clerk, Jill Gubbins and (means of contact to be added.)"

Guidelines for insurance cover – simple 'Housekeeping' tasks in the Parish

Every individual task must have been subject to a risk assessment – this must be documented in advance and kept on record.

PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) should be made available to those undertaking the tasks. For example eye goggles, gloves and high visibility jackets.

The Parish Council should be satisfied those undertaking these simple 'housekeeping' tasks are capable of doing so

Both tasks and those undertaking them must be approved by the Parish Council ahead of any work being completed.

Only basic / simple 'housekeeping' tasks are covered

No insurance cover if the above guidelines are not followed.

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Playpark – response to request for financial information from SHDC – received March 22nd 2018

- 1- There is £24,194 held and pencilled against St Anne's Chapel pitch and play area.
- 2- None that I am currently aware of. The only other on my list for which there was a signed s106 in Bigbury (which stood to raise £27K) was 'Southway' 05/2744/11/F & 05/1473/12/F, however I suspect this permission lapsed and was not built out. I note there was a subsequent application in 2015 at the site however this was withdrawn (05/2274/15/F).
- 3- Not via SHDC, however there are certainly plenty of other funding sources at a local and national level (i.e. Lottery, Trusts, Foundations) I would suggest contact the South Hams CVS in the first instance see http://www.southhamscvs.org.uk/groupsupport
- 4- My colleague Alexis Huggins (Cc'd) will be able to assist with the practicalities we typically encourage applicants to seek match funding to maximise the benefit of the s106 funds. We would expect to see an appropriate tendering exercise, evidence of community consultation, etc. We can of course provide an 'offer' of funds, if and when to assist with evidence of match funding at the time you approach other funders.

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

Dear all at local Councils,

- May I draw your attention to the National Planning Policy Framework review and consultation which closes on May 10th.
- There is a proposal to change NPPF 115 and 116 into one new guideline NPPF 170. In recent years NPPF 115 and 116 have proved to be very effective in preventing unpopular development in the AONB, they clearly submit a number of tests and provide coherent, well defined reasons to challenge inappropriate building proposals within the AONB.
- Landscape and scenic beauty at Wembury and Frogmore has been spared detrimental development recently because of the protection afforded by 115 and 116.
- The revised wording of NPPF 170 is alarmingly ambiguous and will undoubtedly give developers an opportunity to degrade our rolling valleys, woodland and even the heritage coast.
- The Government will be hoping that guideline 170 will go unchallenged, and that is why I am asking that you take a close interest in this review, and make your own representation to the consultation.
- The consequences for your beautiful Parish could be disastrous if NPPF 170 with all it's ambiguity is accepted.

South Hams District Council and West Devon Borough Council are calling out to all community groups, charities, and good causes in the area who might be interested in being part of a new council run Lottery initiative.

The SeaMoor Lotto is a new venture which is being led by the councils to provide a way for local good causes to raise funds. 60% of all money raised will go towards local good causes, 20% of ticket sales will be put towards prizes and 20% will go towards the running costs.

Now the councils want to hear from any interested parties, so that they can be invited to a launch event in May and find out how to sign up to become part of the SeaMoor Lotto.

Cllr Neil Jory, West Devon Borough Council's Hub Lead Member for the Lottery explains: "This is a win win situation. The local charities and groups who sign up to be part of the lottery will be able to raise money for their own projects; we will be able to support local good causes with the proceeds of the lottery and the members of the public who buy tickets stand a chance of winning a monetary prize of up to £25k"

Cllr Keith Wingate, South Hams Executive Portfolio Holder for Business Development added: "Local authority run lotteries are working very well for many other communities around the country. We are working with Gatherwell, the company who manage lottery initiatives nationwide and will provide the know-how. Their mission is to help good causes raise money, their first project was a schools lottery, helping schools across the UK deal with increasing austerity pressures, now they help a wide range of local causes from local community centres to Age UK. With their support and guidance we are in safe hands and will be delivering a lottery service for our community and charity sector that will benefit everybody."

Lottery tickets will only be sold via the internet and tickets will cost £1 each per draw. When a player buys a ticket they will opt to support a specific good cause or contribute to the community fund – the latter will be administered by the Council.

The draw will take place every Saturday evening at 8:00p.m and as with other lotteries the more numbers matched the bigger the prize.

South Hams District Council and West Devon Borough Council expect to launch the SeaMoor lotto to the public in this summer.

Car Parking charges – e mail received 10th April 2018

Hi Richard, following previous emails, I have reviewed parking charges for Bigbury car park and will be proposing to the Executive that only the overnight tariff is increased from £8 to £9. This will meet the 2% increase required.

Please can I raise the following points (all in Bigbury on sea) which I would like some action taken on:-

- 1: Parker Road upper section I.e. above Cleveland Drive section.. 3 large potholes spreading across the road outside Kaduna. Very soon these will join up and become a trench!!!
- 2: Bay Cafe site. The car park has just been mown but unfortunately, they did not cut away all the vegetation covering the yellow lines on the road surface. Also, there is a very large pothole between Nantucket and my property at Deben Reach.
- 3: Marine Drive there are quite a few areas along the bank of the car park from its entrance to the far corner of Marine Drive where the vegetation is covering over the double yellow lines.

Dear Councillors

Some of you have recently been in contact with us to highlight defects needing action. Although we are willing to accept your reports, your NHO does not have (or has ever had) direct control of the contractors workforce and is unable to have these locations given preference above Skanska's own priorities. We do have a good working relationship with our local contractor so can pass these requests on as supplemental if they complete their workload.

However, due to the damage caused by the recent weather Skanska reported an increase in pothole reports. At the Devon Highways Board meeting they proposed to prioritise only defects recorded by the safety inspectors. This decision was approved but has led to a backlog of potholes reported by the public. Since the new year Skanska have increased the number of gangs tackling potholes on the highway network and are working hard to manage the workload but it is expected that the backlog may take weeks to bring under control.

This is leading to the increased contact from your constituents which is likely to continue. Devon County Council and Skanska are working to resolve the issue but currently there is no means for your NHO to intervene in the current working practice. We are aware of the difficulties this causes but appreciate your support through this busy period.
